- Arthurian legends. Sir Thomas Malory and *Le Mort d'Arthur*: features and themes. *Sir Gawain and the Green Knight*: features and themes  
Texts: *Le Mort d'Arthur*, Volume 2, Book 11  
*Sir Gawain and the Green Knight*, Fitt I, vv. 20-36
- Historical background: the Normans and the feudal society; Henry II and the Common Law; the Magna Carta; the Hundred Years' War, the War of the Roses.
- Geoffrey Chaucer and *The Canterbury Tales*: themes and features.

### **The Sonnet**

- Historical background: the English Reformation and the Elizabethan Age.
- The Sonnet: Italian vs English Sonnet. English rhythm: the iambic pentameter.

Thomas Wyatt, *I Find No Peace*  
Philip Sydney, *Sonnet 5* (from *Astrophel and Stella*)  
Edmund Spenser, *One Day I Wrote Her Name* (from *Amoretti*)
- Shakespeare's Sonnets: themes and features.  
Texts: *Sonnets 18, 19, 60, 130*
- John Milton and Puritanism: the religious sonnet.  
Text: *When I Consider How My Light Is Spent*

- Inquiry and experience: the birth of modern science.

- King James Bible: the translation of the Bible and stylistic features.  
Text: *1 Corinthians 13*
- *Paradise Lost*: structure, themes, language, style.  
Text: John Milton, *Satan's Speech* (from *Paradise Lost*)
