
The British Empire



The British Empire was the largest in the world and during the Victorian period a quarter of the world belonged to the Empire. The argument they used to justify British rule was the fear of violence between the different groups. In fact when India gained independence in 1947 a lot of people died and a fellow Hindu, who opposed cooperation with the Muslim, assassinated Gandhi.
